Energy Equality Project



On-line Video Launch

If local renewable electricity was cheaper than your supplier, would you be interested?

That's the question that WREN asked at the launch of its Energy Equality project in April. The launch, originally planned for Wadebridge Town Hall, had to be moved on-line due to Covid-19, and attracted nearly 40 participants, including guest speakers from Loughborough University and University College London.

The launch event attracted mainly those who already have an interest in renewable energy, which meant that many were already solar PV owners. However, to be successful, a peer-to-peer trading system requires a good number of people who don't have panels and just want to buy cheaper electricity.

This means that we are still very keen to talk to all households who would like to buy locally generated electricity at a lower price than currently on offer from big energy suppliers.

How you can be involved

We have previously said that there are four ways in which people, businesses and community groups can be involved in the Energy Equality Project feasibility study. The first reiterates our main point this issue:

(1) You don't have solar panels, but want to participate in Energy Equality to get cheaper, local electricity.

If you don't fit into this category, you might find yourself in one (or more) of the other three:

(2) You own, or are looking to own, solar panels and want to sell your surplus energy to your neighbours for a better price, or to give them a better deal, or both.

(3) You have a rooftop which might be suitable for solar panels and would be happy for WREN to install panels to generate electricity for peer-to-peer trading.

(4) You would like to invest in the new solar panel installations that WREN will create in (3).

We'd still really like to hear from you, via the questionnaire.
