REPORT OF THE CHAIRMAN For the Year Ended 31 March 2017

The Sunshine Tariff project was successfully bought to conclusion during the year. As a collaboration between WREN, WPD, Tempus Energy and REGEN, it offered local electricity consumers the opportunity to buy and use cheap daytime electricity in the summer months. The aim was to evaluate whether shifting the demand for solar-generated power could be a practical remedy for the constraints on the local grid network. Information was disseminated by a webinar which attracted some 200 participants, followed up by a well-attended meeting in Wadebridge Town Hall to which all who had participated in the Sunshine Tariff were invited. The Sunshine Tariff project, forward looking and ahead of its time, is still widely quoted in the specialist literature. It has become an important part of a growing body of evidence about the flexible and personally tailored use of energy.

In last years Chairs report I commented on the new and more difficult policy environment within which WREN must operate. Renewable energy and environmental issues in general are given little priority in the Government's agenda. The whole of the community energy sector in the UK of which WREN is a part has had to rethink its approach; the aspiration to develop and own local renewable energy installations have remained unrealised in large part. Electricity storage is sure to emerge as a need to be met, as the National Grid and network operators adapt to make best use of energy generated from wind and sun and to reduce reliance on the input from fossil fuels.

A substantial sum of money earned by WREN from the Sunshine Tariff project will be carried forward. The Board is, and has been, exploring choices and options for the best use of the funds in line with WREN's objectives. In order to preserve these funds until they can be productively used the Board has agreed ways of going forward on a cost-neutral basis. The budget has been reduced significantly to achieve preservation of the funds. WREN no longer employs an Operations Manager and no longer rents premises to work from. Many of the administrative functions to maintain WREN will be carried out on a voluntary basis.

In the current policy climate we have found it challenging to identify good projects to explore and implement and so in this year we have concentrated on the delivery of the Community Funds generated by wind and sun at Pengelly, Treworder and St Breock, the details of which are available on the WREN website.

 - c) Promoting individual, community and organisational commitment to a reduction in CO₂ emissions for Wadebridge and increasing resilience to resource scarcity;
 - d) Energy saving;
 - e) Establishing the generation of renewable energy at a range of scales;
- The promotion of sustainable development for the public benefit by;
 - a) Enabling a percentage of revenue resulting from renewable energy generation to be invested in local community projects that meet local priorities as decided upon by the membership of WREN;
 - b) The promotion of sustainable means of achieving economic development and regeneration in order to reduce reliance on fossil fuels
- The prevention or the relief of poverty in Wadebridge and surrounding areas by providing grants, items and services to individuals in need and other organisations working to prevent or relieve poverty.
- Subjecting the process to rigorous evaluation by our academic partners (energy audit, process and outcome measures) so that such population's programmes can be generalised elsewhere.

REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT AUDITORS For the Year Ended 31 March 2017

We have audited the financial statements of Wadebridge Renewable Energy Network (WREN) Ltd for the year ended 31 March 2017 which comprises Income and Expenditure Account, Balance Sheet and the related notes. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS For the Year Ended 31 March 2017

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Going Concern

The accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis. The directors also consider that it is appropriate to continue to prepare the accounts on a going concern basis.

Income

Income represents grants, donations, finder's fees and other income received or receivable. Income is recognised when received or according to the contractual obligation to receive funds.

Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised in the financial statements on the accruals basis.

Grants receivable – restricted

Grant income is recognised in the financial statements according to the earlier of when funds are received or the date an interim project claim is made. Monies due and not received at the year end are shown as debtors. A debtor is also recognised where project expenditure has been incurred and restricted funds are available to be claimed through that project.

Grant expenditure - restricted

Grant expenditure is recognised in the financial statements when the liability is incurred.

Reserves

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific projects which may be declared by the donor(s), or with their authority (e.g., in a public appeal), but still within the objects of the company. Restricted funds may be restricted income funds, which are expendable at the discretion of the directors in furtherance of some particular aspect(s) of the objects of the company, or they may be capital funds, where the assets are required to be invested, or retained for actual use, rather than expended.

<u>Unrestricted funds</u> are expendable at the discretion of the directors in furtherance of the company's objects. If part of an unrestricted fund is earmarked for a particular project it may be designated as a separate fund, but the designation has an administrative purpose only, and does not legally restrict the director's discretion to apply the fund.

Wadebridge Energy Company

Wadebridge Energy Company is a related party of WREN due to the following persons being directors of both companies during the year;

- R Alexander
- J Burnyeat
- C Coonick
- A Faragher

During the year to 31 March 2017, funds totalling £1,436 were loaned to Wadebridge Energy Company by WREN in order to relieve opening cash flow difficulties. As at the balance sheet date amounts owing to WREN totalled £2,736 (2016, £1,300).

The loan is repayable upon demand with no interest being charged.

9. LEASING COMMITMENTS

The company entered into a 24 month licence to occupy The Energy Shop on 1 May 2013 in the sum of £9,870 per annum (payable monthly). The licence expired on 30 April 2015 and may be terminated by either the licensee or licensor by giving 3 months notice.

Notice was subsequently given on 30 April 2016 with The Energy Shop being vacated on 15 July 2016.

10. WREN CURRENCY

The Wren currency was launched in November 2012 initially available as a Wr25 note. A Wr5 note was introduced during the year to 31 March 2015. One Wren (Wr) equates to £1 sterling.

Wrens are issued by the Wadebridge Renewable Energy Network (WREN) Ltd to people who take up WREN offers on energy efficiency or energy generation measures. The currency can also be purchased by the general public from the Energy Shop and used in over 50 participating businesses in the town.

Participating businesses have agreed that of every Wr1 that is redeemed by them, only 90% is refundable to the business with the remaining 10% being donated to the Community Fund.

All Wren currency in the community at the balance sheet date is redeemable and as such a creditor of £2,133 (2016, £2,574) has been included. The creditor movement has been calculated at 90% of the currency income recognised at the balance sheet date less that which has been reimbursed in the year.

11. COMMUNITY FUND

The community fund is designed to award monies to local community groups each year. Community groups are invited to apply for various levels of award from the fund with selection being controlled by the members who vote through a ballot system.

For the years to 31 March 2016 and 31 March 2017 there were no community fund awards.

The sum of £77 was transferred to the Community Fund during the year to 31 March 2016 as a result of Wren currency purchased. The balance of the fund as at 31 March 2017 is £356 (2016, £356).

12. REIMBURSEMENT OF UNRESTRICTED FUNDS FROM BIG ENERGY SAVING NETWORK

During the year to 31 March 2016 a reimbursement was made to Unrestricted Funds from the Big Energy Saving Network amounting to £1,829. Due to a delay in the receipt of grant monies from Big Energy Saving Network during the year to 31 March 2014, Unrestricted Funds were required to finance the project.

Agreement has now been received from Big Energy Saving Network that the funds have been correctly applied and that all expenditure had been made during the allotted time period.
